

United Uranium Corp. – Update on Winter Exploration Program

April 30, 2008 - Saskatoon, Saskatchewan - United Uranium Corp. (UUC-TSX Venture)

Six overburden holes were drilled in the Peace River kimberlite project during the month of March. Depths varied from 25.9 metres to a maximum of 76.2 meters and all holes penetrated bedrock. The basal till was identified in all holes and samples taken. The cuttings will be analysed for kimberlite indicator minerals which will be used in conjunction with existing sampling and geophysics to locate any kimberlite pipes on the property. The qualified person for the project is Paul A. Hawkins, P.Eng. The Peace River project which is a joint venture (50%) with Star Uranium Corp. (SUV-TSX.V) is located 70 km to the southwest of the Diamondex (DSP-TSX.V)/Shore Gold (SGF-TSX) JV cluster of kimberlite pipes.

The initial winter exploration plans included diamond drilling of the 3600 hectare South Bear uranium property located on the eastern edge of the Athabasca Basin. Because of scheduling conflicts diamond drilling of the property did not take place and has been rescheduled for this summer. The drill program is aimed at exploring the potential for a high grade “Unconformity-type” uranium deposit possible related to the untested radiometric and geochemical anomalies present on the property.

The company is still awaiting the judgment of the Saskatchewan Court of Appeal in the appeal by Shore Gold Inc. (SGF-TSX), heard February 11, 2008. This appeal stems from a decision of the Saskatchewan Court of Queen’s Bench which decided a dispute over ownership of 25 claims in the Fort à la Corne area in favor of Star Uranium Corp. and United Uranium Corp. (UUC-TSX.V) in 2003.
